What you can DO:

In Anishinaabe-Aki/Michigan, the Mt. Pleasant Indian Boarding School operated from 1893 until 1934. The Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe has uncovered records and oral histories that indicate at least 227 children died at the school during its 41 years of operation. The school was operated by a mission of the United Methodist Church. The Holy Childhood of Jesus Indian Boarding School operated in Harbor Springs from 1886 until 1983. It was one of the last such schools to close in the U.S. Holy Childhood was operated by the Sisters of Notre Dame and the Franciscan Brothers, under the oversight of the Catholic Diocese of Gaylord. The Holy Name of Jesus Indian Boarding School operated in Baraga (Assinins) and was operated by the Sisters of St. Joseph.

The truth about U.S. Indian boarding school policies has been largely written out of the history books. Healing, justice, and reconciliation must begin with truth-telling and learning. View the powerful film "Dawnland" to learn about the impact of such genocidal practices on Native American children and their families.
